Columbia Basin Trust Act

- Crown Corporation
- Not an agent of government
- Legislated purpose
- Cannot relieve gov't of obligations
- 12 Basin Directors
- Columbia Basin Management Plan

1995 Financing Agreement

- Endowment capital from the provincial government of \$321 million:

Power Investments \$276 Million

- Arrow Lakes Generating Station
- Brilliant Dam & Expansion Project
- Waneta Expansion Project

Non-Restricted Investments \$45 Million

- Private Placements
- Market Securities

- Additional \$32 million in operating grants payable in annual amounts of \$2 million, last payment received April 2010.

The Trust is...

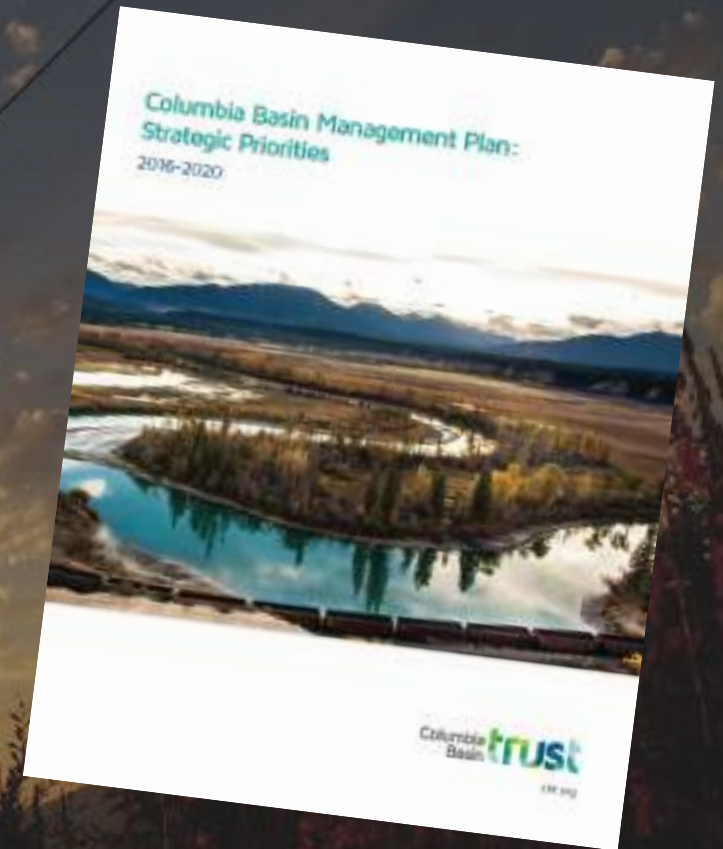
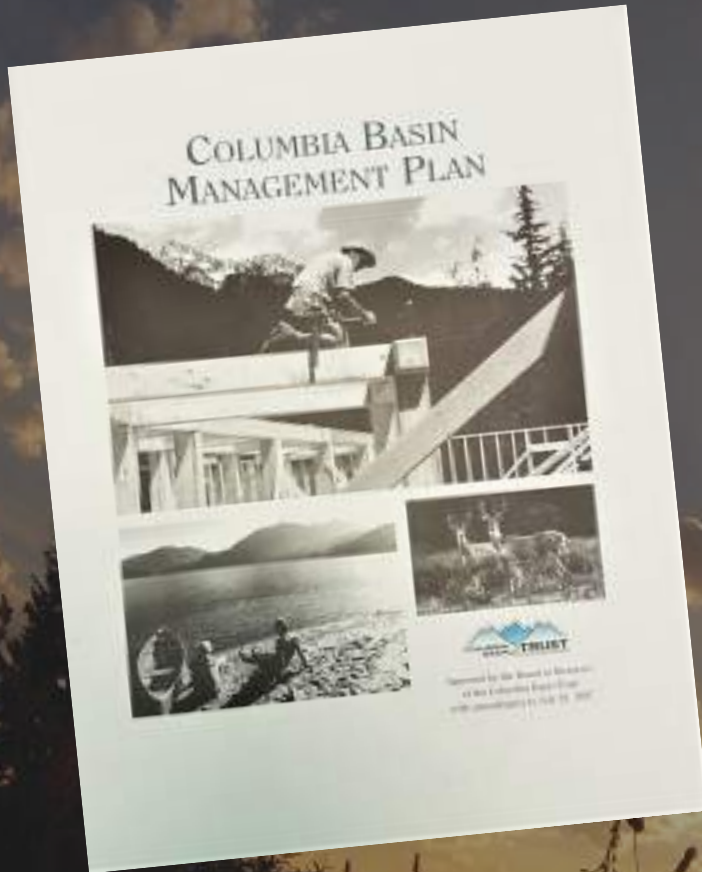
- a creation of a common and unified voice
